BioINSouth is now in full swing across eight regions—Campania, Peloponnese, Andalusia, Asturias, Centro Region, Nouvelle-Aquitaine, Slovenia and Cyprus—with local actors working together to shape a more sustainable and inclusive bioeconomy. The project's mission is clear: help regions make smarter decisions by offering digital tools and guidelines based on the Safe and Sustainable by Design (SSbD) framework.

These tools support environmental impact assessments for bio-based industries and align with EU goals for a fair and green transition.



Over the past year, BioINSouth has been steadily building its foundations and growing its community. The project kicked off with strong coordination led by SPRING, setting up the management structure, data governance, and internal collaboration tools. CTA led the creation of vibrant Multi-Actor Regional Groups (MARGs), bringing together voices from government, academia, business and civil society. These groups now feed into the regional HUBs, activated with guidance from BIOEAST. On the technical side, LEITAT delivered the environmental monitoring system and benchmark report, while INNEN launched the mock-up of the BioINSouth Toolkit for stakeholder testing. PNO has driven communication and stakeholder mapping across Europe.

A major highlight was the 1st BioINSouth Forum, held in Catania during EU Green Week 2025, where regional leaders, EU institutions and civil society came together to explore how circular bioeconomy can drive sustainable transformation. The Forum showcased regional HUBs, fostered cross-project collaboration, and marked the beginning of a broader conversation on inclusive, place-based bioeconomy strategies.

The 1st BioINSouth Forum: Connecting Regions, Shaping Futures

On 5–6 June 2025, the city of **Catania** hosted the **Ist BiolNSouth Forum**, a flagship event organised under the umbrella of **EU Green Week 2025**. Held at the Aula Magna of the University of Catania, the Forum brought together regional leaders, EU institutions, researchers, entrepreneurs and civil society to explore how circular bioeconomy can drive sustainable transformation across Southern Europe.





The Forum opened with welcome messages from institutional and local representatives, followed by keynote speeches from **Virginia Puzzolo (CBE JU)** and **Fabio Fava (CNBBSV)**, who framed the bioeconomy within global policy agendas—from the G20 to COP29. Their contributions set the tone for a Forum focused on innovation, responsibility and regional empowerment.


A central highlight was the session "BioINSouth HUBs: 8 Regions to Shape the Circular Bioeconomy", where representatives from Campania, Peloponnese, Andalusia, Asturias, Centro Region, Nouvelle-Aquitaine, Slovenia and Cyprus shared their regional priorities and visions. The dialogue was grounded in local realities and framed by a shared ambition to co-create inclusive and tailored bioeconomy strategies.

The 1st BioINSouth Forum: Dialogue, Synergies, and the Road Ahead

The Forum also featured satellite events, including a session on Mediterranean bioeconomy challenges, as well as a Synergistic Projects Corner, showcasing complementary EU initiatives and fostering cross-project collaboration. The **2nd BioINSouth General Assembly** that also took place, served as a strategic milestone for the consortium, with discussions centred on the launch of the BioINSouth Toolkit and its upcoming stakeholder testing. A key outcome was the formalisation of the regional HUBs through signed Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs), reinforcing the commitment to co-creation and long-term collaboration across the eight participating regions.



As BioINSouth moves into its next phase, the Forum stands as a testament to the power of dialogue, co-creation and regional leadership. It marked the beginning of a broader conversation—one that will continue to grow through the HUBs, stakeholder networks and future editions of the Forum.



MARG Kick-Offs: Local Voices, Shared Vision

Over the past months, the BioINSouth consortium has launched Multi-Actor Regional Groups (MARGs) in each of the eight participating regions: Campania, Peloponnese, Andalusia, Asturias, Centro Region, Nouvelle-Aquitaine, Slovenia, and Cyprus. These kick-off meetings brought together stakeholders from government, academia, business and civil society to co-develop tailored working plans and validate regional analyses.

The MARGs have been formally delivered to the EC, marking a key milestone in BioINSouth's stakeholder strategy. More than advisory bodies, they are the intellectual engine behind regional activities—driving HUB development as collaborative platforms for testing, knowledge exchange and policy shaping. This transition reflects BioINSouth's commitment to co-creation rooted in local insight and ambition.
